All Saints Day

The 1st of November is known as "All Saints Day". It is traditionally a day when the lives of those people who have been recognised as "saints" are celebrated. Most people, if they think about saints at all, would think of the statues we see in some places with haloes around their heads! However, what the Bible describes as a "saint" is rather different.

The English word "saint" comes from the Latin word "sanctus" from where we get the word sanctified. 1 Corinthians 1 v 1 refers to "those who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, saints by calling, with all who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, their Lord and ours". When we call on the name of Jesus in faith, He hears us — "WHOEVER WILL CALL ON THE NAME OF THE LORD WILL BE SAVED" (Romans 10 v 13). We are saved by confessing our sin and believing in Jesus. By dying on the cross for us he not only purchased our salvation but there is more! "We have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all" (Hebrews 10 v 10).

We have been sanctified and Jesus now recognises us as saints! So "All Saints Day" becomes for us a celebration of the fact that every born again believer in Jesus is a "saint"!
